"For all that has been, Thanks. For all that will be, Yes!"

This quote from Dag Hammarskjold, the second United Nations Secretary-General (1953-1961), and 1961 Nobel Peace Prize recipient, offers a context for this issue of *The View*. Looking back on 2021, most of us probably feel like it was a "mixed bag" of blessings and curses.

Certainly, the brief summer respite from rampant Covid infections and a return to some sense of normalcy is a blessing, but what about the surges that preceded that respite and the ones that followed? Can we as people of faith find some blessing there? Can we find God's presence in the



many faithful healthcare and "essential" workers, including our own dedicated staff members, who put aside their fears, limited their other activities and came in every day to care for patients, stock grocery shelves and assist our residents in everyday matters?

> We can hardly be grateful for the deaths, 800,000 in our country alone and growing every day, but we can be grateful to have known these people and to have shared joys and sorrows with them in the years before they died. We can be grateful that their deaths did not mark an obliteration into nothingness, but rather a transition to a new and glorious life. During the depths of Covid, many felt isolated and depressed, but many discovered new hobbies or rediscovered old ones. Many saw new opportunities to reach out to the next-door or across-the-street/hall neighbors; they found ways to bring comfort and strength to others through simple acts of kindness – and found themselves being comforted and strengthened in the process.

All that has been said about dealing with the epidemic can also be said about the Great February Freeze. While no one was thrilled to be in the midst of it, we saw our staff make heroic efforts to care for residents, including moving in! Empty apartments and offices became places of rest and refuge for workers who thought that if they left, they might not be able to return so they stayed around the clock for several days. For them we say, "THANKS!"

After looking back on the blessings of 2021, with trust in God's providential love, we can say "Yes!" to whatever 2022 brings. It seems like Covid in its many variants will be around, but we have learned how to cope with it better. Maybe we'll have to get Covid boosters every year, but thank God we have the

vaccines and they are readily available. No one will be surprised if there is another weather-related calamity of some kind, but with the help of friends and neighbors, those most deeply affected will be cared for and in the process may discover just how much they are loved.

For all that has been, Thank you God. For all that will be, Yes, Lord we believe you are always with us.

Skilled Nursing Services now available!



The Village at Incarnate Word (TVIW) welcomed its first client to its skilled nursing unit on October 2, 2021. Earlier in the year, DeMatel House Extended Care was certified by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) as a skilled nursing facility (SNF).

What is a skilled nursing facility (SNF)?

A SNF is an in-patient rehabilitation and medical treatment center staffed with trained medical professionals. Skilled nursing care is a high level of medical care that must be provided by or under the direct supervision of licensed health professionals, such as registered nurses (RNs) and physical, speech, and occupational therapists. These services can be necessary over the short term for rehabilitation from an illness or injury, or they may be required over the long term for patients who need a high level of care on a frequent or constant basis due to a chronic medical condition.

Examples of skilled nursing services include wound care, intravenous (IV) therapy, injections, catheter care, physical therapy, and monitoring of vital signs and medical equipment. Skilled nursing care must be ordered by a doctor to be covered by Medicare, Medicaid or private health insurance. As a SNF, TVIW offers our residents the benefit of receiving skilled services on-site in DeMatel House as part of the continuum of care services.



In addition to the benefit of SNF services, TVIW has partnered with Select Rehabilitation.

As a provider of on-site therapy services, Select Rehabilitation focuses on maintaining function, enhancing quality of life, and overall wellness. Their goal is to assist and support the residents in maintaining an active and healthy lifestyle by offering proactive, comprehensive therapy services. Select Rehabilitation staff will offer services within the DeMatel House SNF as well as to residents in independent living and assisted living through their outpatient program.

Sandy Woodard, Caregiver

"I have a client who lost his leg a year ago in a car accident. This year, I noticed that he didn't have a Christmas tree so I asked him why. He shared with me that last Christmas he was homeless, so he doesn't have much. So, a group of my friends and I decided to get him a tree and presents too. When I went to help him set up the tree and give him the presents, he started crying tears of joy.

I love that I get to take care of people. I get to root for the underdogs and help bring them out of their shells. It's the best job I've ever had."

Roger and Beverly La Fond, Clients

Roger, 88, and Beverly, 84, met in the Air Force in 1961. They were married in 1962 and will celebrate their 60th anniversary in 2022.

In 1986, Roger had three cerebral hemorrhages. Despite a doctor saying that he would only live five more years, Roger has lived comfortably for over three decades. He communicates mostly non-verbally and requires around the clock care. Luckily, he has a loving and patient caregiver in Beverly and assistance from other caregivers through Sisters Care.

Caregivers have assisted the La Fonds with various tasks, but the most noteworthy is respite care. With respite care, Beverly can go out of town or run errands and know that a skilled caregiver is with



Roger and can tend to his needs while she is away. When with Roger, caregivers provide assistance cleaning and dressing him, escorting him to meals, transferring him to bed, housekeeping, and more. Beverly and Roger are grateful to caregivers Diana, Michelle, Rosalinda, and Sisters Care office staff Frances, Clarice, Jennifer, and others for all of their assistance over the years.



Anna Garza, Caregiver

"The best part about being a caregiver is the clients. They're so sweet. I don't see them as a job - I see them as family. I tell them the reason I see them that way is because I know that we're all headed that way and when I'm their age, I would love someone to treat me the way that I treat them.

I help with cooking, laundry, light housekeeping, or just being there to spend time with them. I especially love plants, so I will even re-pot plants or do outside work for some people. It's not in the scope of normal caregiving duties, but I don't mind going above and beyond. If it puts a smile on a client's face, I'm more than willing to do that."
