
In considering the role of service in fulfilling our mission to extend the healing ministry of Jesus Christ to all those we serve, our first consideration must be the words of Jesus himself. In the Gospel of St. Matthew, he quotes Jesus as saying “The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to give his life as a ransom for many.” (20:28) The spirit and centrality of service could not be clearer! And this service is not to be some half-hearted feel-good effort; no, this service is sacrificial, in imitation of Jesus who gave his life for our salvation.

In the Gospel of St. John in his account of the Last Supper, just before Jesus’ arrest, he records that Jesus gave an example of service by washing the feet of those present. To grasp the full meaning of this action, we must understand that this task was one assigned to a household slave or servant. Jesus said to his disciples, “If I then, your Lord and Teacher have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another’s feet” (13:14) Jesus’ humble example exemplifies the need for humility in offering service. Here in The Village at Incarnate Word, our dedicated staff are not allowed to say/ have the attitude of “That’s not my job.” If something needs to be done for a resident or visitor and a staff member is able to do it, it becomes his/her job! If the staff member is unable to tend to the need in a timely manner, they must report the need to someone who can help. This is the “Incarnate Word Way.”

We are truly blessed that our residents also exemplify a spirit of service. Our Resident Ambassadors generously and graciously give their time to introduce new residents to the facility and activities in the first weeks of their residency. Our liturgical ministers help us all to pray by serving as lectors, cantors, accompanists, and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, who bring Communion to those who are sick or unable to get to one of our chapels for Mass. Others, very informally go to visit former neighbors who have moved to higher levels of care, bringing moments of joy and reassurance that their friends still remember them. It’s not unusual to see residents retrieving mail for a neighbor, walking a neighbor’s dog, bringing a cup of coffee or tea to another friend. The examples of service lived at The Village are innumerable.


